Consistent effort secures club win

The ten-point lead TuMe gained in Saturday's individual competition guaranteed the overall victory in the club match. OK Vöru still tried on Sunday to close the gap in the relay by splitting their strength between two teams; a double victory would have turned the overall win to Vöru. However, TuMe won the relay ahead of the Estonian teams that placed second and third. This time, OK Meridians finished a clear third.

Vöru's Sild brothers, Timo and Lauri, nevertheless placed among the top three in the individual race. TuMe's strongest performer was Jossu, who took silver in the individual race and ran the fastest leg in the winning relay team.

The winning team consisted of Johan Ek-Larsson, Tapani Koskenoja, Uldis Upitis, Vesa Arki, Toni Rannikko, Harri Poutiainen, Marek Minar, and Tuomas Peltola.

The individual race was held in Merimasku, with courses setted by Teemu Niskanen. Juha H was the relay course setter in Impivaara, Turku. Hannu calculated the results, and Joni took care of accommodation. Skärde prepared the closing meal at the Kolo.

Is TuMe the organizer of the 2032 Jukola Relay?

Once in a lifetime? Organizing the Jukola Relay? That is something Turun Metsänkävijät has never experienced – nor any other project of similar scale.

Now, however, the club's chairman Mikko has informed the Kaukametsäläiset that TuMe, together with MS Parma's background clubs MS -52 and Liedon Parma, is eager to host the 2032 Jukola and Venla relays in Southwest Finland.

By the end of February, clubs must declare their interest in organizing the Jukola Relays for 2031–2033. After that, an inspection of the proposed competition center and terrain will be carried out, and based on this, clubs must submit an official application next autumn.

Receiving the organizing responsibility is by no means guaranteed – there will surely be many applicants. One thing we can point out is that we have never organized the relay before. In 2032, the orienteering club will turn 70, and MS -52 will celebrate its 80th anniversary.

The three participating clubs would organize the event jointly and with equal responsibility. In preliminary discussions, TuMe's responsibilities would include overall management, course planning, and terrain work. In addition, we may have the skills and enthusiasm to support IT and media services, as well as infrastructure construction at the competition center, although the main responsibility for the latter should rest with MS-52, as the event would most likely take place in their home terrain. Financial responsibility would lie with Liedon Parma. Both partners, in any case, have extensive expertise from organizing the Lukkari-Jukola in 2022.

The core organizing team for Jukola requires around 15 people committed for 2–3 years, and about fifty people for roughly one year. One third of these roles would therefore fall to TuMe. Altogether, the Jukola Relay needs around 1,400 volunteer workers.

Suunnistusmänkijä received reader feedback in November. According to one reader, the nicknames used in the bulletin nicely reflect the scouting tradition within the club, but they would also like to get to know the club's top orienteers better and follow their achievements in the results lists.

For this reason, Suunnistusmänkijä now publishes a dictionary of the top athletes' nicknames and their real names. In addition, the editorial team decided to publish at least some of the real names behind the nicknames of the club's local active members and more senior elite runners.

For some, nicknames have hardly been used at all. For example, Jussi is Jussi Salonen, Timo is Timo Lainema, and Simo is Simo Uusikartano. A special case are the many Juhas, two of whom do not have established nicknames, yet all appear in nearly every issue of the bulletin. Altogether there are three: JuhaH is Hiirsalmi, JuhaT is Juha Taini, and JuhaS is Sundman, meaning Juha Sunttila, who has invented many of the nicknames, and keeps inventing new ones all the time.

For many people, traditional nickname forms derived from first names are used, such as Masa for Matti Salonen and Hantta for Hannu Arki. These are not included in the dictionary. Others, with short surnames, are often called simply by that, such as Ari Palo as Palo and Pekka Inki as Inki.

If you think the dictionary is missing names altogether, or if another, more fitting nickname is already in use, let the editorial team know and we will publish more later. For now, the editorial team will aim to use the list of names found on the next page.

Finland's number one in TrailO

Based on the points collected by Juha H, TuMe is Finland's number one TrailO club in the 2025 Finnish Championships.

In standard orienteering, the club is ranked 39th, a couple of places better than a year ago. The rankings list includes 47 TuMe members. The men's main series list includes 17 names.

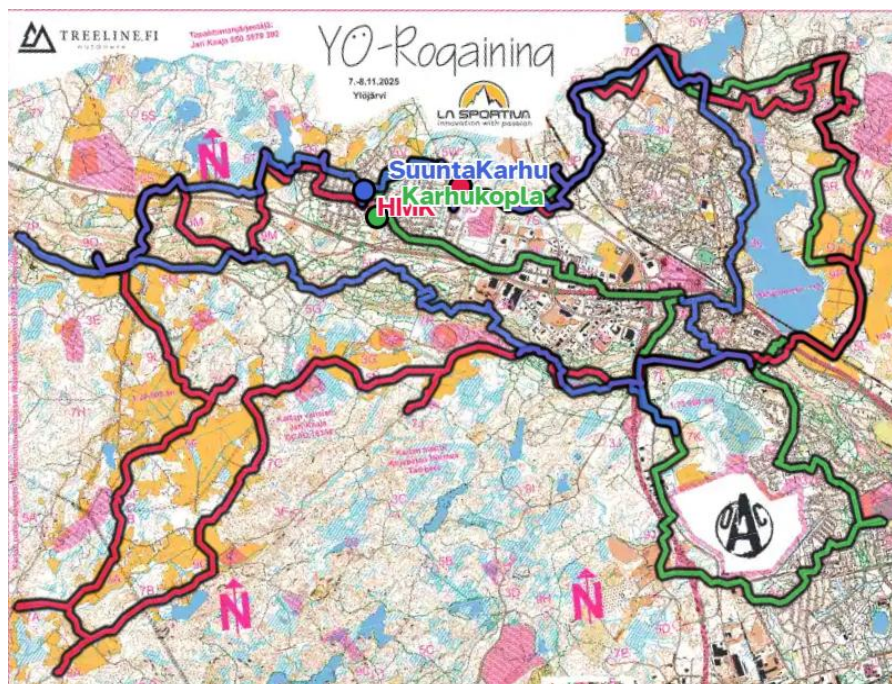
The club has 151 members, and according to membership fee statistics, there are 26 juniors.

November is the golden age of rogaining

In addition to the popular Turku Rogaining Nightsprint, there are many other rogaining events in November. The rogaining competitions organized by Hatman in Eastern Uusimaa and Kymenlaakso culminated a week ago in the Christmas Porvoo Rogaining. The four-hour foot race results list includes Anna Alanen in 15th place with her partner and Jouko Kössi in 25th place with the team name TuMe Single.

With nostalgic old scout names, Suuntakarhu and Karhukopla competed in the dark for eight hours in the Night rogaining in Ylöjärvi on the second weekend of November.

Suuntakarhu's Lergo and Raija defeated their challengers Karhukopla's Patu and Häiskä. They finished 9th and 13th. 40 teams had dared to participate in the longest race. The victory over the whole race went to TuMe, when Ville Taimi and his partner collected the most points. According to the GPS, they covered 56 kilometers. The other TuMe runners had just 42.
